Core text for English	Throughout this half term, our core text is "The Boy Who Grew Dragons," by Andy Shepherd. A Story about a boy who discovers a strange, old tree at the bottom of his grandad's garden.
Supplementary texts	Then, we will be reading 'The Climber's,' by Ali Standish. A Story about lonely Alma who longs to explore the lush forest beyond her narrow town. 'How to be a Lion,' by Ed Vere.
English focus	 Creative writing/ Poetry Finger spaces, full stops and capital letters Statement, question and exclamation sentences Understanding word groups - nouns, verbs, adjectives and adverbs Using noun phrases and expanded noun phrases - adjective + noun or adjective, adjective noun Direct speech Similes Tenses Paragraphs
Phonics focus	Daily Phonics and Reading practice sessions. This term, we will be recapping some of the Phase 5 review sounds and word cards from the Little Wandle's Letter and Sounds programme. Any gaps in the children's knowledge will be followed up with an intervention using Daily Catch-up. <u>https://www.littlewandlelettersandsounds.org.uk</u> Please see the following link for parent support at home; <u>https://www.littlewandlelettersandsounds.org.uk/resources/for-parents/</u> We teach children to read through reading practice sessions three times a week. These are taught by a fully trained adult to small groups of approximately six children. We use books matched to the children's secure phonic knowledge using the <i>Little Wandle Letters and Sounds</i> <i>Revised</i> assessments and book matching grids on pages 11–20 of 'Application of phonics to reading'. The decodable reading practice book is taken home after the third reading session to ensure success is shared with the family. Please bring reading records and levelled/ chapter books every day.
Maths focus	Time:

	• Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times
	• Know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day
	Read time on a clock to the nearest 15 minutes
	Geometry: properties of 2D and 3D Shapes
	 Identify and describe the properties of 2-D shapes, including the number of sides and line symmetry in a vertical line
	 Identify and describe the properties of 3-D shapes, including the number of edges, vertices and faces
	 Identify 2-D shapes on the surface of 3-D shapes, [for example, a circle on a cylinder and a triangle on a pyramid]
	 Name some common 2-D and 3-D shapes from a group of shapes or from pictures of the shapes and describe some of their properties (e.g triangles, rectangles, squares, circles, cuboids, cubes, pyramids and spheres)
	 Name and describe properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes, including number of sides, vertices, edges, faces and lines of symmetry.
	 Describe similarities and differences of 2-D and 3-D shape, using their properties (e.g. that two different 2-D shapes both have only one line of symmetry; that a cube and cuboid have the same number of edges, faces and vertices, but different dimensions).
	 Order/arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns/sequences
	Position and Direction
	 Describe movement, including whole, half, quarter, and three-quarter turns
	Recognise and create repeating patterns with objects and shapes
	Describe position and direction

	 Adding and subtracting two-digit numbers
	 Using household items to count and make groups such as pasta, socks etc.
	 Playing dice games such as Ludo to help with number recognition.
	Homework will be given out every Friday. Sometimes documents will be added onto Google Classroom. To log into Google Classroom, use your child's unique username followed by @stjosephsgsuite.co.uk and their unique password. Year 2 class is referred to as 'St Teresa of Calcutta' class. Homework must be returned on Wednesdays. It is essential that you practise phonics with your children regularly to continue to develop their reading ability and understanding of language.
